# Fire use and wildfire risk in Europe; communication needs for societal involvement

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## Some issue regarding wildfire risk and forests in Europe

- From fire as a “tool” to wildfire as a hazard.... in one generation!
- Changing context of risk...
  - Traditional knowledge in crisis
  - Wildfires appear in non usual areas (including central and northern Europe)



## Some issue regarding wildfire risk and forests in Europe

- People “loves” forest, even they don’t know how it works ... all have to be protected
- Fire service (the more visible) is acting only in the end of the causal chain .. From forest fires as a rural development issue moving to a urban and spatial planning issue .. New actors involved
- Wildfires are burning forest but overall houses and urban areas (from natural hazard to global emergency and civil protection priority)
- Fires nº and surface statistic data does not help to explain the situation





## Some issue regarding wildfire risk and forests in Europe

- Fire as the “enemy”, technological “myth” and ignition causality emphasis make difficult to explain the fire as a perturbation (resilient landscapes?)
- Wildfire as a natural hazard? Or human made? ...“no ignition no fires”?
- Wildfire risk, a cross-sectoral issue affecting several policies (forest, rural, land planning, education, ...) ... risk mitigation strategies need times and strong coordination without clear cost benefit cash flow ... societal support is needed
- Are the responsibilities regarding risk prevention clear enough? What to communicate?

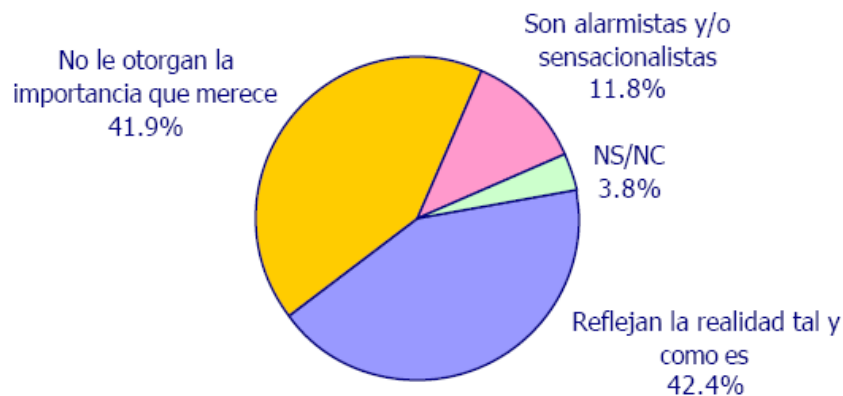

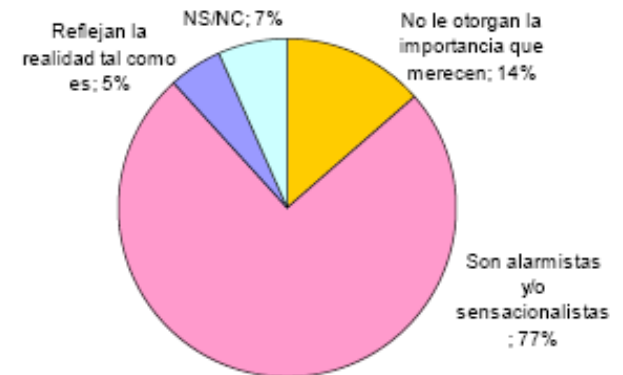

## Needs of communication for societal involvement

- What we want?
  - Citizens experts on fire ecology...  
*.. for public support to long term cross-sectoral policies*
  - Enhance self-responsibility and self-protection?  
*... for more effective civil protection and emergency management*
- New actors involved, new boundaries of knowledge transference and communication





## Needs of communication for societal involvement

- **Factors affecting the individual capacity of action** (Martin et al 2007):

**The perceived effectiveness of actions to reduce the risk**

**Confidence in the ability to correctly carry out actions**

**The perceived responsibility for fire risk management**

**Trust and credibility to the institution promoting actions**

- Be coherent, be credible ...

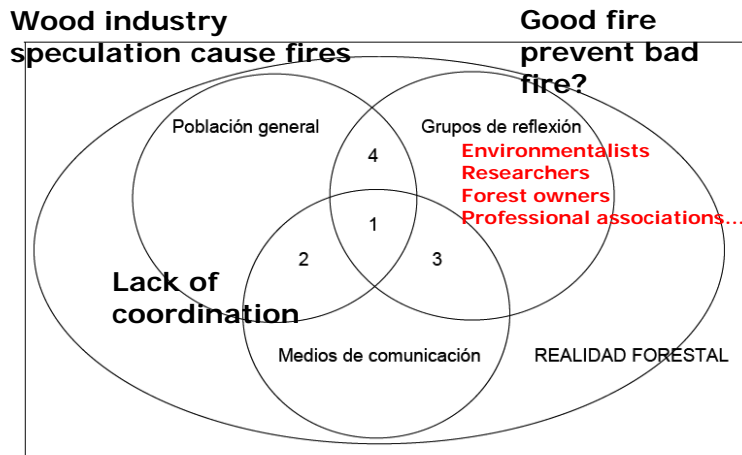


Ilustración 1. Casuística del modelo de construcción social de las percepciones..

## Needs of communication for societal involvement

- Any wildfire event is offering a media window... be proactive (and imaginative, media is seeking for something new to explain.. And there is a nice history to be explained)
- Strategic communication is needed; target audience focus oriented (towards citizens versus towards municipalities to involve citizens)
- Use the planning process and governance tools to involve actors and communicate
- Create communication alliances (e.i with environmental NGOs);  
To increase the penetration of the message  
To increase the scope and credibility of the message

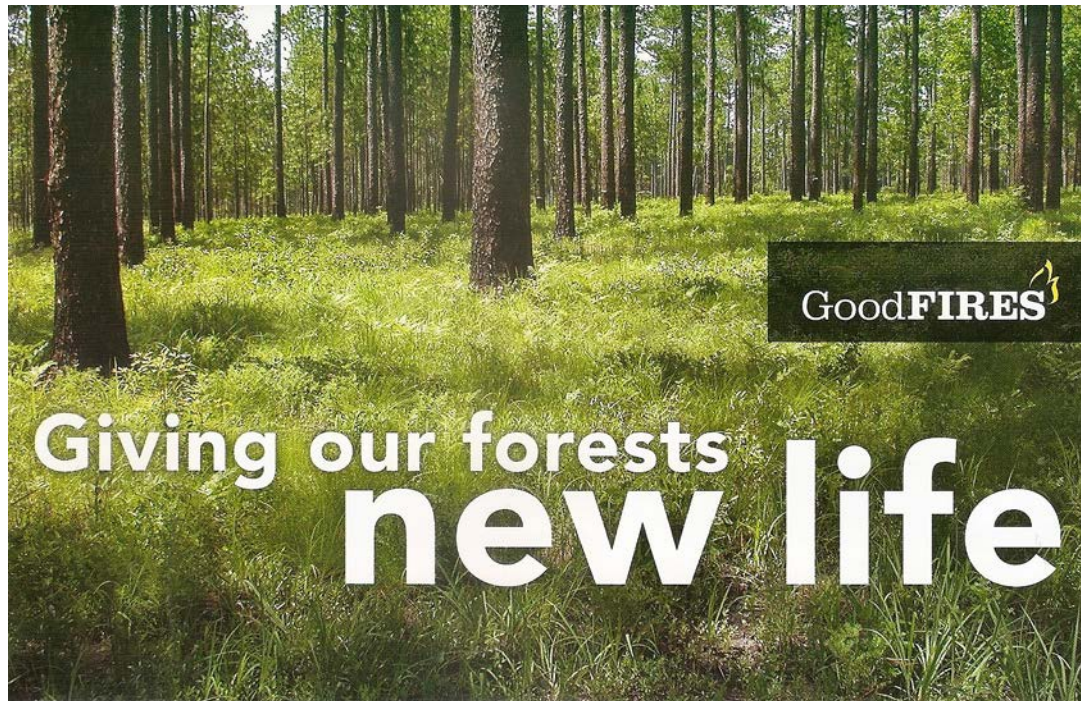

## How to reach societal involvement in the fire risk mitigation?

- ✓ **A better social understanding of the phenomena is needed in a global emergency context where fire affects forest, infrastructures and people all together**
  - Fire risk is not only an issue of ignitions but a propagation capacity of landscape
  - Understanding of the fragility and vulnerability of environ to make people aware on the exposition of risk, the need of prevention and self-protection (WUI inhabitants) and the responsibility in fire ignitions control
  - Telling the role of fire as a natural disturbance make easier to understand the need of getting less vulnerable landscapes as alternative to invest only in suppression system which has a limit
  - Involving land planners in reducing settlements and infrastructures vulnerability to fire risk
- ✓ **Globally, social and political concern on fire impacts should be used to emphasizes the role of forest management and rural development policies on wildfire risk mitigation, from a social, economic and ecological perspective**
- ✓ **Communication is more and more a crucial element in wildfire risk management strategies**
